

Contemplative Action Retreat
Friday, April 26 - Wednesday, May 1, 2002

Contemplative prayer is an invitation to the presence of Spirit; to be open to the infinite is to open to compassion; compassion necessarily overflows into service for others. The retreat will begin with three days of instruction and practice in contemplative prayer, including both Eastern and Western spirituality led by Ruben Habito, who was an ordained Jesuit priest working in Japan and now teaches Zen Buddhism. This will be followed by three days of the integration of contemplative prayer with social action; spending each morning at a volunteer work site, followed by a half day of meditation and yoga. The afternoons are lead by Joan Rieck, a former Maryknoll nun who worked and studied Zen in Japan, along with Anil Poovadan, who is certified as a teacher by B.K. Iyengar in India.

Cost: \$400--Full program including housing at Tepeyac; \$200--Weekend with Rueben only, no accommodations.

This workshop is ONLY available to the over 1200 men who have made the rites of Passage at Ghost Ranch, or in Germany and Austria. It will likely be given for several years and will be limited to 150 participants each year. It will require an application form detailing what the prospective participant has done for other men since his own initiation, and what he hopes to do in the future. Interest groups will include men and boys at risk, church and parish based groups, family based initiations, the incarcerated, gay men, and initiation rites for Black or Hispanic men.
