In this retreat, given at the Center for Action and Contemplation in Albuquerque, New Mexico December 29, 2000 to January 1, 2001, Groves tells stories of people, stories that transform other lives. He opens up a lot of issues and then puts everything back together. He offers contemplative descriptions, as well as beatitudes, for each type. He asks the participants to name their sacred question.

Groves has 25 years experience in the fields of spirituality, healthcare and psychology. He and his wife Mary are founders and co-directors of *Sacred Art of Living*, a national pastoral training center in Bend, Oregon. Richard has used the unique perspective which he calls the *Contemplative Enneagram* as a tool for diagnosing and responding to spiritual pain, both for persons at the end of life and for all spiritual seekers engaged in the sacred art of living.
