Workshops, retreats, and personal study of the Enneagram have increased dramatically, and this popularity has led people to seek for further information concerning it. Questions range from how to know one's type to how the Enneagram is perceived by psychologists, theologians, and those using it for pastoral care and spiritual direction. Richard Rohr has had extensive experience with its use and is a principle contributor to this fascinating collection. He gives a review of what the Enneagram is and the nine personality types that comprise it, and places it within a religious context. This is followed by experts in several fields who give their appraisal.

Of special interest is the inclusion of a 115-question Enneagram test that can help a person discern his or her type.

Richard Rohr, a Franciscan of the Cincinnati Province, is an internationally known retreat master, speaker, and writer. Presently, he is the director of the Center for Action and Contemplation in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He, together with Andreas Ebert, has written *Discovering the Enneagram*, and is well-known for his audio and video tapes. He has been conducting workshops on the Enneagram for over a decade.

Andreas Ebert is a Lutheran minister, hymn writer, and translator into German of books by Richard Rohr, Walter Wink, and Jim Wallis.
