Prayer and Contemplation by Richard Rohr, OFM. A lecture on the importance of both action and contemplation in the spiritual life. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Follow Me. Social activist, poet and prophet Daniel Berrigan, SJ, like Jesus, helps people see what they have not seen before. Using accounts of healings from Mark's gospel, Dan illustrates the public, political, provocative and dangerous nature of Jesus' ministry and what it calls us to be and do. (5 tapes, \$20.00)

Coming Out, Coming Home: A Place in the Church for Gays and Lesbians. Pastor and teacher Jack Clark Robinson, OFM, presents a well-researched and thought-provoking historical overview of the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church and Scripture regarding homosexuality. CAC Co-Director Wendy Corry shares insights on the integration of sexuality and gay/lesbian spirituality. (2 tapes, \$8.00)

Contemplative Prayer. Former CAC co-director Christina Spahn talks about the prayer form practiced at the Center. Topics covered include the true self, characteristics of, preparation for and challenges of contemplative prayer. An excellent resource for beginners and "veterans" alike. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Contemplative Stance in Gospel Living by Richard Rohr, OFM. Recorded in March, 1997, this homily and address focus on learning to live non-judgmentally in the present or "now", and discuss 1/point to the gospel as that by which we see everything else correctly. (2 tapes, \$8.00)

Discipleship and Spiritual Maturity Albuquerque Pastor Donna Lockridge discusses spiritual maturity as "a willingness to be in process," and characteristics of the disciple including passion, courage, a sense of wonder and "converting people to the concept that God is for them." (1 tape, \$4.00)

Discipleship in the Marketplace. What Does Jesus Really Want Us to Do? by Jeff Dietrich and Sandra Huckaby. Reflecting on their experience of working at the L.A. Catholic Worker, Jeff and Sandy lead a discussion exposing the myths of the dominant culture and desacralizing what French Theologian Jacques Ellul describes as the new sacred "technique." The dialogue examines the relation of our call to perform simple works of mercy with our cultural philosophy of "technological determinism." (4 tapes, \$16.00)

Exclusivity versus Inclusivity by Richard Rohr, OFM. This talk was presented to the national Religious Education Convention to help contemporary Catholics understand the perennial tension between conservatism and liberalism. A Scripture study that reveals how Jesus resolves the tension. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Living Our Fathers/Being A Brother by Richard Rohr, OFM. This is a set of five tapes recorded at a men's retreat in December, 1991. The tapes examine the four predominant male archetypes of king, warrior, magician, and lover as guides for the spiritual quest. Richard also spends time on a man's relationship with his father and with his other. (5 tapes, \$20.00)

St. Francis & Clare: Models of Liberation. Pastor and teacher Jack Clark Robinson, OFM, profiles the founders of the Franciscan order including the resistance they met as they set out their unique vocations. Jack's appreciation and love for his subjects comes through in this enthusiastic and knowledgeable presentation. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Franciscan Quincentenary Conference by Richard Rohr, OFM. Richard calls his Franciscan community back to the radical reading of the Scriptures that characterized St. Francis. An insightful and visionary treatment of Creation Spirituality, Franciscan non-violence, Lower Class Solidarity, and "No Baggage Evangelization." This set consists of talks that most participants wanted to re-hear. (3 tapes, \$12.00)

Gospel and Social Responsibility. This four-tape series is a conference that Richard Rohr led for the peace and justice communities in Southern California. Here Richard tries to expose the underlying myths, the patterns of consciousness, the spiral of violence

Merton's Prophetic Stance: Model and Invitation. Trappist Abbot James Conner discusses Thomas Merton's personality, gifts and struggles, his understanding of the true and false selves, and God's presence among us. Gentle and insightful talks by one who knew Merton personally and has walked the walk. (4 tapes, \$16.00)

Reconstruction: How, What and Why by Richard Rohr, OFM. The introduction and first in a series of talks/discussions focusing on the CAC's 1994 theme of "reconstruction." (1 tape, \$4.00)

Reconstructing Communication and Relationships by Joan Guntzelman. A talk/discussion on the role of individual spiritual growth as central to healthy, honest and loving relationships. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Reconstructing Images of God: Inspiring Our Faith and Worship by Ray Gunzel, sP. An exploration of the timeless yet ever-changing images of God and how these images guide our spiritual journeys. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Reconstructing Sexuality by Pamela White. Reflecting on her own life experiences, Pamela White, an evangelical Christian minister, presents a unique combination of Sexuality 101 and a theology of sexuality. The message: God's love calls each of us to move beyond cultural norms when addressing issues of homosexuality and loving relationships. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Reconstructing Time & Leisure by Wendy Corry. A talk and discussion of positive and constructive ways to manage time at work, at play and with family and friends. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Retreat for Contemplatives by Richard Rohr, OFM. This timeless retreat was given to the Trappists in the early 1980's. It has been widely circulated and acclaimed by many different groups as a broad and rich presentation of the Christian life. (12 tapes, \$35.00)

The Prayer of Jesus in an Ecological Age. This is a recording of a weekend program led by Sister Paula Gonzalez at the CAC in July, 1997. Paula uses a translation from the Aramaic of the Lord's Prayer to illustrate the interrelatedness of all that exists and the challenges this understanding presents to humanity as one species among many. An excellent resource for those interested in eco-spirituality and eco-justice. (5 tapes, \$20.00)

Scripture and Liberation. Richard Rohr, OFM, addresses the Exodus experience, Jubilee spirituality, the prophets and self-critical thinking, and Jesus and human liberation. Recorded at Scripturefast 1997 in Alberta, Canada, in October. (4 tapes, \$16.00)

The Simple Life: Gracious Living on \$6000 a Year by Mary Ann Fiske, Chuck Hosking, Birgitta Gabel and Kurt Wulfekuhler. This Reconstruction talk explores "downward mobility" and how a life of voluntary simplicity calls individuals, families and society towards spiritual and social transformation. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Social Analysis and the Gospel by Richard Rohr, OFM. An overview of economic and political structures relating to the teaching of Jesus. (1 tape, \$4.00)

Spirit and Soul: Kissing Cousins by Richard Rohr, OFM. An excellent summary of Richard's recent theme, the cutting edge of spirituality today, with massive implication for Church morality, and our understanding of what is "natural." (1 tape, \$4.00)

A Theology of Liberation by Richard Rohr, OFM. In this four tape set, Richard explores some of the major themes of liberation theology in depth. (4 tapes, \$16.00)

Wildmen and Wildwomen by Richard Rohr, OFM. Richard discusses the intersection between the men's movement and prophetic feminism. (1 tape, \$4.00)
